## Irv Condon Grand Marshal

### 2026 Charleston St. Patrick's Day Parade



Irvin Gerard Condon (Irv) was born at St. Francis on March 21, 1959, 7 of 10 children of Harriet Molony and J. Joseph Condon. Patience is learned sharing a bathroom with 8 siblings. Irv is named for Uncle Irvin Molony and St. Gerard, patron saint of mothers and unborn. Irv's twin sister died before birth. Irv realizes he was lucky 7 and often ponders missed family joy of his twin.

Irv, Michelle, and Joseph, members of Cathedral, live in Irv's childhood home in historic West Ashley, Charles Towne's location, Carolinas' birthplace. Michelle, Irv's angel from "country roads" of "almost heaven" WV, teaches at Charleston Law, has Notre Dame, Northwestern, and W&L degrees. Joseph Tulane Irvin, named for grandfathers, Uncle "Iron" Joe, grandmother Tulane, Uncle Irvin, a high schooler, played many sports, won a cross-country state title, top 25 in SC Junior Golf, hopes to play college golf.

Irv's parents stressed faith and education. Irv graduated from Blessed Sacrament, Bishop England, attended the College, graduated magna cum laude from Clemson, reluctantly passed on a Wharton MBA, worked for Price Waterhouse as CPA before graduating USC Law. Irv practiced at Rosen, Rosen & Hagood; grateful for mentor Morris Rosen and learning law from talented firm members and Irv's Chicago friend Tony Nimmo. In 1994, citizens elected Irv Probate Judge and is honored to serve. Irv is an adjunct professor writing a probate textbook.

Folly, fishing, sports, and Notre Dame, father's alma mater, were family priorities. At the College, his mom held a state swimming record. His dad, a WWII Army veteran protected the Panama Canal, and at 6'5" played basketball. Irv played for coaches Jack Cantey and George Griffith on BE's 1977 State Runner Up football team. Irv fondly recalls role model, visionary Mayor Joe Riley, wishing the team well before the championship. Irv, like every BE student, now appreciates Principal Nick Theos' discipline. The BE senior class voted Irv, Most Dependable. Irv coached over 25 years junior high basketball, teaching Wooden's life lessons, winning championships, and beating a friend's team a national season record 11 times. His father believed in God, Country, Notre Dame. Irv wishes the Clan would live by this example; if not, jokingly, then purgatory.

Irv founded the James Hoban Society honoring the underappreciated architect of Charleston's Historic Courthouse (probate's location) and White House and commissioned Charles DeAntonio to paint Hoban's portrait. Senator Thurmond arranged White House access to study the Hoban figurine. Hoban's portrait hangs in the Courthouse, with replicas in Leinster House and the DC Irish Embassy. Denis Bergin, Laurie Grace, descendant Dennis Blaschke, Harry Cale, Alan Medlin, and others placed markers at Hoban's Kilkenny birthplace and held workshops on Hoban, an immigrant success where diligence and education led to great achievements.

His father (Condon's Department Store) taught Irv to focus on customer service which Irv stresses with his probate team helping citizens, especially the marginalized. Irv started Drug, Mental Health, and Veterans Courts; second chances, not prison. Charleston is the only probate court with electronic filing 24/7, LOVE marriage, visitors, and treatment programs. Irv provides free probate workshops.

Irv is humbled and honored to be Grand Marshal of the Parade he and the family so much enjoy. God Bless America! Erin go Bragh!

My dear brothers in Christ,

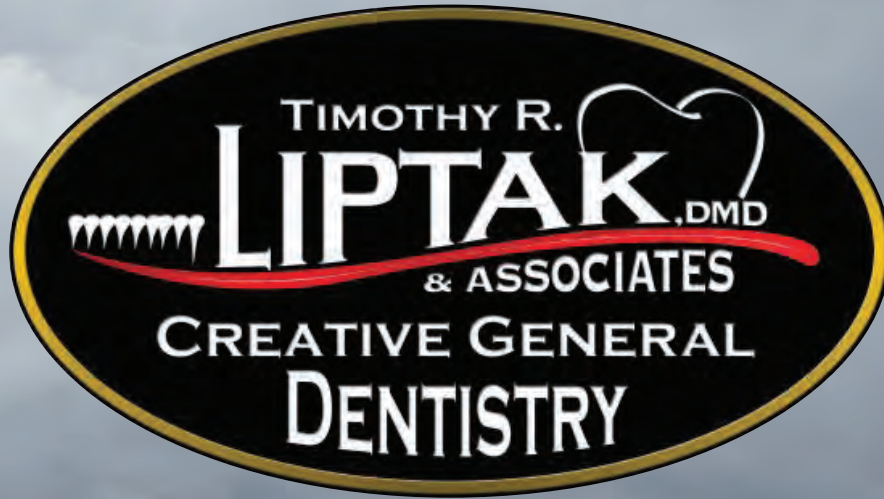

# *Celebrating Saint Patrick's Day in Charleston*

Céad Mile Fáilte  
(a hundred thousand welcomes)

Saint Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. His feast day on March 17 is a national holiday in Ireland and is celebrated throughout the world by the Irish and those of Irish decent. There is evidence of St. Patrick's Day celebrations in the Charleston going back to the mid-eighteenth century when groups like the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick met to celebrate the day. The Hibernian Society, founded in 1799 and reconstituted in 1801, used March 17 for its annual banquet. Parades began in the nineteenth century and were usually led by the various Irish militia units. Local Irish historian, Donald Williams notes that the earliest parade was on Broad Street in 1823 when the Irish Volunteers paraded after a speech by Bishop John England. By the end of the century, the processions had grown substantially in size and length. Usually starting at the Irish Volunteer Hall on Vanderhorst Street, they proceeded down King to Broad, over to Meeting, and back to Calhoun Square, dropping off the various groups at their respective halls along the way. These parades continued into the twentieth century but stopped in the mid-1920's when most of Irish organizations folded. By the 1930's all that remained was the Hibernian Banquet, joined in the 1940's by a Knights of Columbus dance. In the late 1950's the Knight of Columbus began celebrating Mass in St. Patrick's Church and then in the early 60's, went to their hall for a luncheon, replacing the dance as the major focus of the day's activity. In the 1970's the Hibernian Society began their short parade along Broad Street to the Hibernian Hall. In 1998 a small group of men from the Ancient Order of Hibernians, a group originally founded in Ireland in the early 1600's, marched down King Street thus resurrecting Charleston's annual St. Patrick's Day Parade on the traditional ceremonial parade route of the city. In 2008, the students of Bishop England High School began marching in the parade as a lead unit carrying the Irish County Flags. In the spirit of the day, it's common custom that everyone, regardless of background, is Irish on Saint Patrick's Day. Enjoy the day!

# Irish-American Heritage



## Remembering the Dearly Departed Irish of Charleston and the State of South Carolina



Since 1991, to honor the achievements and contributions of Irish immigrants and their descendants living in the United States, Congress and the President have proclaimed the month of March as Irish-American Heritage Month. The heritage month in March coincides with the Irish national holiday of Saint Patrick's Day and the parades and celebrations held across the United States on that day. The Irish were among the first to settle in Charleston in 1670 and throughout the centuries Irish immigrants and their American-born descendants have seized the opportunity to work hard, enjoy success, and pursue the American dream in Charleston and South Carolina. With a hardy character, strong ties to family, faith, and community, through public and military service, industry, talent, and imagination their accomplishments and traditions have stamped the emerald mark of Ireland on the history and culture of Charleston and our state.

The following are a few of the many dearly departed Irish that we remember this day.

### Harriett Molony Condon

She was born in 1925 and was educated at Bishop England High School received both bachelor's and master's degree in education from the College of Charleston. After her marriage to Joseph Condon in 1949 she began an amazing life journey that would include her exemplary role as wife and mother to 10 children. In raising her family, she emulated the ideals of Catholic motherhood and instilled in each of her children the importance of faith, education and love for one another. In addition to raising a large family, she also embraced a career as a catholic school teacher and principal. During her tenure at St. John's Catholic School she was credited, with the assistance from a dedicated staff, with revitalizing the school to meet educational standards of the diocese and thus saved the school from closure. She retired in 1999 and St John's Catholic School continues operation as Charleston parochial school today. In addition to her family and educational career, she also was involved in other activities that centered around church and charitable causes. As a member of various Catholic women's organizations at the national and international level, her achievements were well recognized with various awards to include the Papal Medallion presented to her by the Bishop of Charleston. She was also a member of the BEHS and CofC alumni associations and the South Carolina Irish Historical Society. Today, many of her children and grandchildren also celebrate their Irish heritage as members of the Society. She was widowed at age 58 and, bolstered by her faith and love for her family, she continued as family matriarch for another 35 years. When she died in 2018 she was remembered by many as a true daughter of the Lowcountry and woman of great character that left an incredible living legacy playing out in the lives of her children and descendants. She is buried beside her husband in Holy Cross Cemetery

### Thomas Francis "Frank" Baker

Frank was born in 1947 and raised in Charleston and was a graduate of Bishop England High School and The Citadel. He married a high school classmate, Peggy Finnegan, and after an active duty tour in the USAF, he and family settled in Savannah Georgia. He worked for AT&T and Lucent Technologies and joined the Georgia Air National Guard and served until retirement as a Lt. Colonel in 1997. Outside of work he became active in church and Irish organizations. At the Cathedral of St John the Baptist he served several terms as Chairman of the Parish Council and also was chairman of the Cathedral Ball. He was inducted as a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem in 1998 and he received the Bishop Francis X Gartland Service Award in 2010. He was proud of his Irish ancestry and he was a member and past president of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, an historic Irish-American organization founded in Philadelphia in 1771. Additionally, he was on The Savannah Parade Committee and served on the Executive Committee and as Chairperson of the Sgt. William Jasper Green Ceremony, an event held annually as part of the celebration of Saint Patrick's Day in Savannah. He died in 2013 and is buried in the Cathedral Cemetery in Savannah. He was survived by his wife, 4 children and family in Savannah and Charleston.

# Irish-American Heritage

## Remembering the Dearly Departed Irish of Charleston and South Carolina

### Francis Condon Wham

He was born in Charleston in 1956 and died after a few months of illness in 2025. He was known as "Bud" by everyone and he grew up on James Island, attended Nativity Catholic School, Bishop England High School and the College of Charleston. He was a man of varied interests but first and foremost was his love and devotion to his wife, children and family. He was an avid sports fan especially BEHS and Notre Dame football. He was a member of the Charleston Notre Dame Club and was past president of the Triple B Club supporting Bishop England athletics. He was immensely proud of his Irish heritage that traced back to William Condon who emigrated from County Tipperary to Charleston during the Irish Potato Famine and he felt a special bond with his extended (and numerous) Irish-American family members in Charleston. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 704 and also the South Carolina Irish Historical Society and the Charleston Division of Ancient Order of Hibernians. He served as AOH Division president in 2015-2017. Bud was also a valuable member of the Saint Patrick's Day Parade Committee and year after year he stood out as one of the hardest working members on the Committee. His efforts spanned fundraising thru the selling a program ads, coordination of parade participants such as the U.S. Marine Corps Band and especially his promotion of ideas at Committee meetings to control costs and improve and sustain the parade. Of particular note is that Bud was one of the primary supporters of the idea for the Parade Committee to commemorate the Centennial of Bishop England High School in 2015 by placing a bronze marker on Calhoun Street to denote the downtown location of the high school for over 70 years. He was survived by his wife, children and family and is interred in Holy Cross Cemetery.

### Frederick W. McMahon

Fred or Freddy, as he was called by many long-time friends, was born 1939 in Charleston and grew up on Grove Street. He was a good athlete and loved playing baseball and basketball on Hampton Park playground and in later life he took to playing golf. He was a graduate of Bishop England High School and was crowned as "Mister Bishop England" in his senior year. He was a graduate of Clemson College (now University) and upon graduation he was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the US Army and served a tour of duty in Europe. His professional career as an electrical/electronic engineer entailed frequent travels across the USA and when away he would often seek out a local Irish pub for a reasonably priced meal and a pint or two. Travel was nice but it was the Lowcountry, old friends and family that he cherished the most. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 704 and during his tenure as Grand Knight he initiated the first annual Turkey Day Run in 1978. Freddy truly valued his Irish heritage and was a member of the Hibernian Society and also a member and past president of the South Carolina Irish Historical Society. He died in 2023 and is buried in St. Lawrence Cemetery. He was survived by his brother, 3 nieces and a nephew.

### David C. Runey

A native Charlestonian, he was born in 1950 and was a graduate of Bishop England High School and the College of Charleston. During his school days, he was a fine multi-sport athlete and in later life he loved the outdoors especially fishing and playing golf. He was in the restaurant business and ran a diner, "Kitty's Fine Foods," for over 20 years. David was a truly happy person who always had a smile on his face and was a friend to most everyone he met. He was a member of the Hibernian Society, the Ancient Order of Hibernians as well past Grand Knight of Knights of Columbus Council 704. He loved all things Irish and was delighted to fulfill his lifelong dream of playing golf in Ireland. On Saint Patrick's Day, he would celebrate by riding in the big parade while wearing a green suit with shamrocks printed all over. He passed away last year and was inurned at the Columbarium at St. Joseph's Catholic Church. He was survived by his wife, 3 children and 4 grandchildren.

### Judith McMahon McDowell

Judy was born in 1941 and raised in Charleston and was a graduate of Bishop England High School and the College of Charleston. She grew up during the happy days of 1950s and 60s and was gifted with inherent athletic ability from her parents who were both athletes and coaches. She played basketball on the BEHS girls' team that was coached all 4 years by her mother and she was also on the CofC basketball team. She was on the first girls tennis team at BEHS and would remain active in sports (tennis and golf) until late in life when health issues prevented her participation. She was married, the mother of 2 children, and was employed in the community, first with the Charleston Chamber of Commerce and then for many years with the U.S. District Court where she served as Deputy Clerk of Court. She enjoyed cooking for her family, Atlanta Braves baseball, Clemson football and her family's Irish heritage. She along with her 2 brothers were charter members of the South Carolina Irish Historical Society and she became the Society's first female president in 1986. She passed away in 2023 and is buried in Holy Cross Cemetery. She was survived by her children and 2 brothers.

### Lawrence W. McKeethen

He was a third generation Irish-American born in 1925 and raised in Charleston. Due to a humorous occurrence in his childhood he acquired the amiable nickname "Hambone" within his family and he would be called "Hammie" by everyone for the rest of his life. He was a graduate of Bishop England High School and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and the Korean Conflict. After the death of his parents, he and his brother Frank, who was a professional fishing guide, became the sole owner-operators of a recreational site located on the banks of Lake Marion in Pineville, SC. The site was known as Mack's Fish Camp and was open to the public for camping and fishing. He was a member of American Legion Post 62 in St. Stephens and lived in Pineville. He died in 2003 and is buried alongside his brother and parents in Riverview Memorial Park in North Charleston. Today, the camp is known as Mack's Landing Camp and it remains an outdoor recreational venue in Berkeley County.

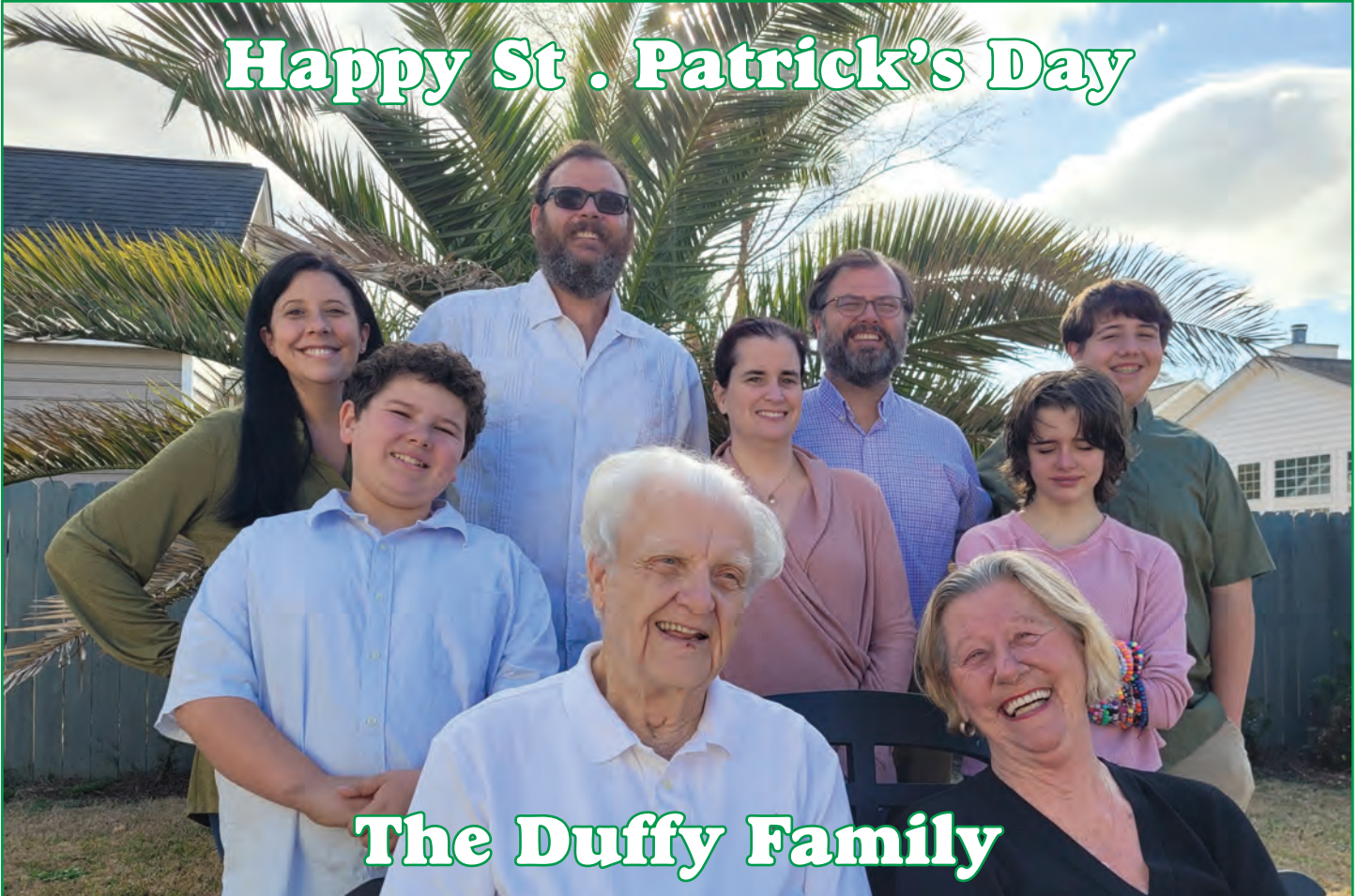

In July 2022 the James Hoban Societies of the US and Ireland came together to present a portrait of James Hoban by Charleston artist the late Charles DeAntonio to Dáil Éireann Ceann Comhairle (Speaker of the House) Seán Ó Fearghail and Seanad Cathaoirleach (Senate Chairman) Senator Mark Daly at Leinster House (Ireland's Capitol). The building is recognized as an influential model for the design of The White House.

# James Hoban Society

Joseph Condon stands where President John F Kennedy addressed the Irish Parliament on June 28, 1963 as the first President of Irish descent to visit Ireland while in office. In his address, President Kennedy references how James Hoban must have designed the White House with a future Irish American President in mind. Born in a thatched cottage in County Kilkenny, Ireland, James Hoban rose from a journeyman carpenter and wheelwright to become the architect of the world's most famous house, the White House. James Hoban was architect of the Charleston County Courthouse. His reputation as a practical builder was such that his name was mentioned to President George Washington during the President's visit to Charleston in 1791. This resulted in Hoban entering a competition to design the President's house and beating out the likes of Thomas Jefferson to become the architect of the White House. Hoban used the oval in many of his designs, including the White House, to enable a smooth flow of people and so that no one, including a politician, could be trapped in a corner.

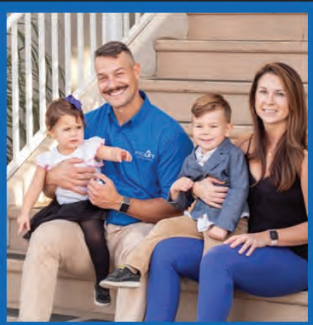

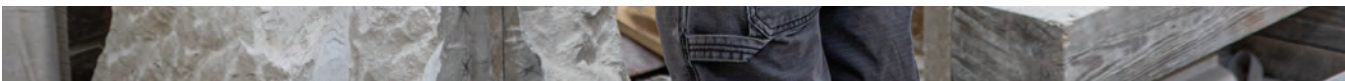

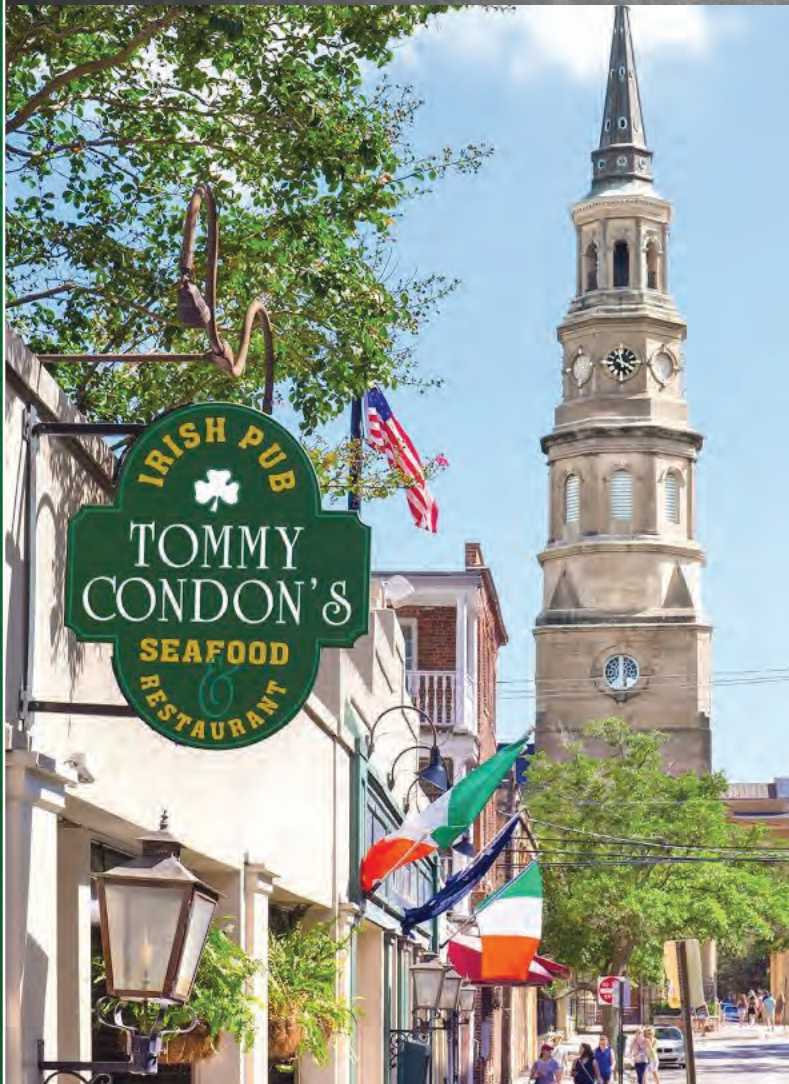
